God's Goodness

"Surely goodness and mercy shall follow me all the days of my life, and I shall dwell in the house of the Lord forever." Psalm 23:6

We live in a World that is full of negative thoughts and actions, sadness and pain, difficulties and trials and if we are not careful that is where our focus will dwell. Recently, many studies have been done on the power of "positive thinking" as opposed to negative. Not only does it affect every aspect of a person's life, it literally rewires the brain for the better. Thinking on good things seems to highjack the outcomes of perceived negative situations and changes for them for better with positive outcomes.

I had someone recently ask me, "but how can I focus on "positive" when everything in my life is negative". You might even be thinking the same as you read this. My response... Have you ever just thanked God for His goodness, instead of only seeing your negatives? We know that God is merciful, gracious, patient, longsuffering, is slow to anger, and forgives us of all of our sins (1st John 1:9), and these are the very essence of His goodness. I'm sure you've heard the phrase, "God is good...all the time," and that's consistent with Scripture. He is good to grant repentance (2nd Tim2:24-25), and then purchase us by His own blood (1st Cor 6:19-20, 7:23), so that we might "dwell in the house of the Lord forever." When we think on the Lord, it's evident His goodness follows us around. Let's start rewiring our brains and changing our negative situations and thought patterns by dwelling on his goodness.

See Him In the Oark

"Then the LORD came and stood and called as the other times,
"Samuel! Samuel!' And Samuel answered,
"Speak, for your servant hears.'"

1 Samuel 3:10

Our God is One Who Sees. He saw a young boy all alone in the temple at night. It was dark. The word of the LORD was rare. Then the LORD came and stood by Samuel's bed. HE spoke the boy's name again into the dark night. The third time, the boy responded in obedience.

This Scripture gives us a beautiful picture of a God who stands in the dark with us. Have you ever felt alone or discouraged by a situation you face? This verse demonstrates how HE stands with us in that dark place beckoning us to turn and run to Him. All we need to do is draw near to Him. You are not alone. Put your focus on Him, not the darkness around you. He is waiting.

Did you notice how the LORD continued to call Samuel multiple times? He doesn't stop after one try. He pursues us. He will keep calling your name until you respond. He desires personal relationship with each of us. We can't earn His favor. We are not chosen because of our amazing qualifications. Samuel was just a young boy, he didn't deserve to be the next prophet. He wasn't even born in Eli's family! He was the "adopted" boy. Yet, he was exactly who God chose. He chooses you too. You have a purpose. The LORD wants you.

HE is calling us today. Take a few moments to thank Him for standing with you in the dark and for choosing you. Then pause and listen. He wants to speak to you today.



Sptravagant Love

"But for right now, until that completeness, we have three things to do to lead us toward that consummation: Trust steadily in God, hope unswervingly, love extravagantly. And the best of the three is love."

1 Cor 13:13

Is it better to love or be loved? I believe this is a question that some people struggle with or are unaware of the answer to.

There are some who go through their life working for promotions, volunteering and serving on multiple charities, and creating busyness in their life. They feel happy with their accomplishments but in the end of the day, think they need to do more. They believe that life is just about doing good and helping/loving on other people. But is this all there is for them?

There are others that just feel hopeless and isolate themselves from others. They do not feel that anything they do is enough, so why bother trying. Nothing they can do seems to matter. Do they know they are loved, and it is not about what you do?

The answer to my question above, I believe, is both. You need to be loved and also be love for others. However, how can you love truly, if you do not know that you are loved first by Jesus?

Jesus paints a perfect picture for us with him coming to earth, living as full man, perfect with no sin, and then dying on the cross for ours. He knew everyone's sin (including yours) that they would do and still chose to love us! Now that is Extravagant Love!

I challenge you today to FIRST let Jesus love on you and then be love to others. Get yourself in a room, by yourself, and just wait on Him. He will ALWAYS show up. He knows everything you are going through, the good and the bad. Just present these things to Him and ask Him to love on you.

Now for the second challenge, now that you know that you are loved, let's love on others! You can do this by a simple phone call, video call, text, email, mailing them something, ect. (Sticking with social distancing now). In the future, you can include going out for coffee, having a meal with them, buying some groceries, paying a bill, etc. You never know what is going on in their life, but the Holy Spirit does and will guide you in what to do. Stand on the truth that God is going to move through you, be hope to them, and just love on them!

Romans 15:13



This beautiful hymn was written by Helen Howarth Lemmel in the year 1918, right at the height of "The Spanish Flu". Lemmel was inspired by a pamphlet she had read entitled "Focused", written by missionary Isabella Trotter. Trotter wrote the pamphlet about the difficulties of maintaining focus while living in a world of so many choices. You see, Trotter had been offered a prestigious position as an artist that would make her famous, but art could be her one sole passion. She wrestled with the draw of fame, but could not deny the pull of her Savior, to have Him be her sole passion. Ultimately, she became a missionary in Algeria and used her beautiful art and writing to bring people to Jesus. The Father opened up landscapes and vistas she would have never seen if she had taken the path to fame, while allowing her the privilege of leading countless lives to Jesus.

While the world is swirling around us, and we are bombarded by choices and information, where will we set our focus? Will we look at the world around us, and become overwhelmed? Will we see with eyes only for this earth? Or will we set our eyes on Him, the author and finisher of our faith, the One who knows what tomorrow holds. Let Him guide you in your decisions, let Him give you heaven's eyes to see what He sees. Colossians 3:2 says, "Set your sights on things above, not on earthly things."

I hear the accuser roar, the ills that I have done. I know them well....and a thousand more....Jehovah findeth none!

These are the words of a song that I often use to remind myself that there is NO Condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus! If I deny my sin — make excuses or even try to hide from others, I deceive myself and even make God out to be a liar. But if I confess and agree with God about my sin, then I am FREE!. The rest of the song says: He findeth none, He findeth none...I've been washed in the blood of the Lamb.

Recently I realized when I read the Psalms, I usually skip over Psalm 119 - It has 176 verses! But I think the real reason is that I feel condemned. Just read verses 1-3 and see what you think – blameless, do nothing wrong, fully obey. I can't do that! This time, I was led to make notes in three columns. 1. God 2. Me 3. Others

I was surprised by how often the psalmist asks the Lord for help. These prayers asking God to help overlap the first two columns in my notes. God is the one who empowers us to walk in His ways and obey His commands. I have made these prayers my prayers too.

Try reading Psalm 119 and write down the prayers. It also helps me to underline some of the verbs. Here are a few examples to get you started.

v. 10 Don't let me stray, v.12 <u>Teach me</u> your decrees v.19 <u>Open my eyes</u> that I may see wonderful things in your Word

"Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling"

1 Peter 4:9

A half an hour before company comes over and you're rushing around, cleaning every surface, grumpy with your children who keep getting out toys, and- oh no!- is something burning??? How's your Oirt?

Of all the parables in the Bible, Jesus made a striking statement, regarding the parable of the sower. In Mark 4:13, Jesus inquisitively asked his original 12 disciples, "Don't you understand this parable? How then will you understand any parable?" To Jesus, the importance of understanding the parable of the sower, is imperative to producing the Kingdom life. Have you ever contemplated why this parable was so important to understanding all the other Kingdom parables? I know I have.

Approximately eleven years ago, I heard a life transforming message by Leif Hetland. In the message, he taught of the sower, the seed, and the soil from Mark 4. Leif's message was simple yet profound – it's about the soil. Farmers are keenly aware of the dirt they plant their seeds in. I live near an active farm, and each year I see the farmers tilling and fertilizing the dirt. The growth of the seed is tied to the fertility of the dirt. Wow! The parable of the sower is about the dirt/soil of our human hearts. As believing believers, it's of utmost importance to cultivate good soil.

Over the past eleven years, I've decided to cultivate the soil in my heart, through intentional quiet times with Father God. Are you ready to produce a multiplying harvest in your life? I encourage you to set a few minutes aside each day and spend that time quietly listening to Father's voice. You will be amazed on how he begins to remove the rocks and thorns, all while, fertilizing the soil of your heart.

One of my favorite things in life is to look back and see how many times despite 'me' the Father in his loving kindness has determined my steps. I want to encourage you today to lay your plans down at the feet of the Father, tell him you trust him with your plans and ask for his direction. Its so much better HIS way.

Unveiled

"And so, dear brothers and sisters, we can boldly enter heaven's Most Holy Place because of the blood of Jesus. By his death, Jesus opened a new and life-giving way through the curtain into the Most Holy Place. And since we have a great High Priest who rules over God's house, let us go right into the presence of God with sincere hearts fully trusting him. For our guilty consciences have been sprinkled with Christ's blood to make us clean, and our bodies have been washed with pure water."

Hebrew 10:19-22

When we hear the word 'veil', we think of...maybe, a bridal veil, a covering over the bride's face until she is 'revealed' to her bridegroom. Or we think of the phrase, 'lifting the veil', which means, "to divulge, explain or reveal something that was secret or hidden". Well, the veil itself has been around for hundreds, if not thousands of years in many different cultures. Remembering Moses in the Old Testament when he came off Mount Sinai, he had to wear a veil because his face shone with the glory of God. He had spent a great deal of time in the very presence of God Almighty.

There's another veil that needs mentioning; the veil or curtain that hung in the Jewish Temple in the Old Testament. When the temple was built, God gave specific instructions on every aspect it's construction. There were 3 parts of the temple; the porch, the Holy Place and the Most Holy Place or the Holy of Holies. The veil separated the Holy Place from the Holy of Holies. In the Holy of Holies was the Ark of the Covenant. Hebrews 9:4 states that the Ark contained "the golden pot that had manna, Aaron's rod that budded, and the tablets of the covenant." It was a place made for the presence of the living God. Once a year the Levite priest was allowed to go behind this veil on the Day of Atonement for the sins of Israel. It is written that the veil was 10 by 20 meters and was around 8 centimeters thick. That would calculate to weighing 4-6 tons!

Upon the crucifixion of Christ, the moment He passed into eternity, this veil was ripped in two... top to bottom. Only God, Himself could have caused that! The veil signified a barrier between heaven and earth, between the Almighty...and us. Torn, it obliterated this barrier, uniting heaven and earth, no longer a physical or spiritual obstacle between God and His people.

The life and death of Christ provided a way to the very throne room of God. "And so, dear brothers and sisters, we can boldly enter heaven's Most Holy Place because of the blood of Jesus. By his death, Jesus opened a new and life-giving way through the curtain into the Most Holy Place. And since we have a great High Priest who rules over God's house, let us go right into the presence of God with sincere hearts fully trusting him. For our guilty consciences have been sprinkled with Christ's blood to make us clean, and our bodies have been washed with pure water." Hebrew 10:19-22(NLT)

The Pathof Life

Psalm 37:23

As a senior in high school, one teacher assigned us to write a short essay about what we'd be and be doing 10 years into our future life. As a naïve inexperienced person who'd not stepped out into the world yet, there was no limit to my imagination. Life was wide open before me. The Teacher in Ecclesiastes tells of his endless quest for life, having pursued it all, denying himself nothing, experiencing every pleasure and pain; there was nothing new. He mused in his writings; the sun comes up and goes down – man kills and eats only to be hungry again. Life is futile – after seeing it all and having it all – there is no satisfaction. Whether a man does good or evil, both die and are forgotten. Life is meaningless.

The fire of God

And with it he touched my mouth and said: "Now that this has touched your lips, your iniquity is removed and your sin is atoned for." Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying: "Whom shall I send? Who will go for Us?" And I said: "Here am I. Send me!"

The bible speaks of fire all throughout both the old and new testament. Fire can be used as a tool to accomplish things or a weapon to destroy. In both cases an intentional burning has a purpose to create something new or clean out what once was.

In Genesis it was a flaming torch that God used to make his covenant with Abram. Sodom and Gomorrah was destroyed by fire from heaven. In Exodus God appeared to Moses in a flaming scrub bush. In Daniel it was a fire in which the three Hebrew slaves were thrown into. In Acts the Holy Spirit came like tongues of fire. In each of these cases the fire was meant to cleanse or create new in either the physical or spiritual. The purpose of fire is to change the vessel and the landscape. "Those who led the way rebuked him and told him to be quiet, but he shouted all the more, "Son of David, have mercy on me!" Mark 10:48

Have you ever felt afraid to ask for help? Or maybe it's the thought that those around you get annoyed when you voice your desperation. Sometimes even, its pride that gets in a person's way of showing their need to cry out for help. Let's just clear this up right now... God is not annoyed by your desperation. If anything, it's that ultimate surrender of pride, that soul bearing prostration of need, and that passionate desperation that makes God move on your behalf. There are so many instances where men and women of faith in the Bible came to a point in their lives in which only their desperate faith filled cries for Gods intervention is what ultimately brought the move of God. But my most favorite is the story of the "Blind Beggar" in Mark 10. Here you will read about a Blind Beggar who hears Jesus going by, so he cries out, "Jesus, Son of David, have mercy on me". Then it says that those around him REBUKED him and told him to be guiet! How many times have you been "rebuked" or silenced in your desperation like the Blind Beggar? Or allowed pride and fear of the "crowd rebuking you" to keep you from crying out to Jesus? There's a happy ending to this parable... even though there was a crowd and it was probably quite noisy Jesus HEARD, STOPPED and then HEALED HIM. You see, Jesus was not annoyed by the persistent beggars' desperation. No, instead it made him hear the beggar and move on his behalf.

God loves you so much! He moves on our behalf when we desperately seek Him and He wants to move on your behalf today! Ignore the crowd, ignore the fear in your head, lay down the pride and uncertainty, step out in faith like the beggar and trust that the God of All Creation is MOVED by your desperation and dogged pursuit of Him! Watch and see what He will DO!

"Anxiety weighs down the heart, but a kind word cheers it up." Proverbs 12:25 This simple verse sounds too good to be true. Can we really ease anxiety with our kindness? The Most High King says YES!! That does not just mean kindness toward others, but kindness toward yourself as well. Imagine approaching every conversation with others with the same love Jesus has for us. Imagine only thinking things about yourself that the Father has told you are true. What a beautiful gift to give to yourself and others. When it feels like our world is falling apart, when it feels like problems are building up, may we remember how we feel when the Lord touches our hearts on our darkest days and return the favor by doing the same for others. Take a moment right now and ask the Most High King what he thinks about you Now, think of someone you can return the favor to. Write that person down and some ideas of how you can show them kindness.

He Speaks

He sees you as a unique individual, so that means He will speak to, and answer you in a unique way that speaks to your heart.

Do you need to hear from Him right now? Do you need His wisdom, direction, answers? Perhaps you just need to hear from Him, because you need the reassurance that you are not alone, and that you matter to Him, more than you can comprehend.

Take a moment right now, quiet your mind and heart, talk to Him, tell Him everything on your mind and in your heart, and then...

Wait.

Wait for Him.

Wait.

It is so worth it. He might come with a picture, a verse, a song, a voice, a comforting presence....just wait. Don't give up. Give Him time. The more you meet with Him, the clearer He speaks because you can recognize Him. This is on you, He's always there ready to commune with you in whatever way He knows you need most. When you receive something from Him, write it down, even if it was just an impression you felt. It's amazing to look back and see the ways He interacts with us!

What did God say? What did you see?

Squirrelly on at Pest

"thus says the Lord God, The Holy One of Israel has said, "in Repentance and Rest you shall be saved, in quietness and trust is your strength. But you are unwilling." Isaiah 30:15

A determined calm. There is a peace in knowing that God as given you direction. Often when I am reading my Bible, in the rocking chair in the kitchen, the cat will jump into my lap and seek my attention. But sometimes he is more like squirrel, twisting and turning, chasing his tail, even digging his claws into my knee. Then I might even bump him off. Other times he settles in, to receive my petting and smoothing of his fur, at rest. In life I find that I have situations that come up where I just plow ahead trying to handle it on my own, in my own understanding. It is like trying this and trying that, without pausing to seek direction by resting and asking in faith.

Then like trusting in swift horses (vs. 16) I end up missing Gods strength and getting run down by pursuing swift horses.

Even vigorous young men can stumble badly in their own strength. We can not outrun our problems. We need to behold our teacher (vs. 20) with our eyes, pause and listen for the word of the spirit telling us; "this is way, walk in it." In the waiting there is still action; walking, running, mounting up. But we gain strength in knowing his direction.

Like wanting the cat to be at rest in relationship, the Lord longs to have compassion. He waits to be gracious to us as we turn to him, praise him, pause and listen for his direction. He waits for us to wait for him! Repentance is turning from our own ways and listening for his direction. He is grieved when we will not.

Prayer; Lord I ask you to give me eyes to see and ears to hear what you are saying. I invite you into our current situation and seek your wisdom and direction. I receive your strength to walk it out.

Transformed Mind

John had been languishing in prison for months, and the work of Jesus hadn't brought the results he'd expected. His disappointment was natural. John wanted reassurance and perhaps help out of jail even. So he sent his disciples to get an answer for his surfacing doubts. "Are you the One whom we've been waiting for that will help us?

Instead, Jesus points to his healing and life-restoring miracles. No promises of jail breaks and overturning the government but clear evidence reflecting the ministry of the Messiah foretold in the OT. Then Jesus ends with an unusual statement; "Blessed is the man who does not fall away on account of me." What was Jesus really saying? He's saying; "The blessing of heaven comes upon those who never lose their faith in me no matter what happens." (TPT)

Like John the Baptist, the challenges of life can be monumental and devastating at times. Some challenges come of our own accord, some by others choices and then there are those that come upon us because life happens. During these challenging times we can get stuck in prisons of disappointment and doubt. Seeking and questioning only to get answers we did not expect and waiting longer than we care to for the release. It's in these times that God's grace is there for you. It's a supernatural amazing grace that allows faith to rise up.

Maybe you blew it with a spouse, your family, a friend, co-worker, or boss. Maybe they let you down or you let yourself down. It could be a tragedy struck home. Whatever it may be don't let troubles and regrets keep you from rising up. Grace is there for you right now. Does the sun stop rising because on some days storm clouds overshadow its' light? I think not. It's kept by the grace of God. You are too! He renews you daily – His grace is sufficient. Rise up!

Speak the words of 2 Corinthians 4:16-18. Make it personal and let them encourage you today. "Therefore we do not lose heart.

Though outwardly we are wasting away, yet inwardly we are being renewed day by day. For our light and momentary troubles are achieving for us an eternal glory that far outweighs them all. So we fix our eyes not on what is seen, but on what is unseen. For what is seen is temporary, but what is unseen is eternal." (NIV)

In a grand entrance spring bursts in with vibrant beauty. Muddied bulbs of daffodils and tulips break open revealing bold and brightly colored attire to parade on a carpet of vivid green grass. Buds pop with delight beaming fresh colors of life. Soon summer explodes on the scene with a prismatic new look for the season. Every tree clothed in its own unique style and shade – a perfect fit and match to adorn each branch. This look is complemented with a colorful display of well-placed, flamboyant wildflowers. Summer gently moves on as fall enters ablaze, bringing the wow factor! Dressed in it's regalia of royal deep stained hues against the backdrop of azure blue skies, the eye is tempted looking everywhere as nature displays the best dressed. Quickly, falls glow fades away as iridescent glistening winter whites reflect every color of the spectrum hidden within it's layers. Delicate flakes glittering like an endless sea of diamonds. And over all this is the one essential basic part of the entire wardrobe for every season; the sun. For without it's radiant brilliant light one could not see the best dressed show on earth.

How does God speak to you through this? Are you showing up in life dressed in your best? Let's consider that when we first come to Jesus Christ, we're in filthy old rags of self, which are then stripped off and replaced with white robes of righteousness. Colossians 3:10 -14 has something to say about how we can best dress for every season of life. "Now you're dressed in a new wardrobe, custom made by the creator with His label on it. From now on you're defined by Christ. So, chosen by God for a new life of love – dressed in the wardrobe picked out for you; you'll never be happier nor look more better than when you show up wearing, compassion, kindness, humility, quiet strength and patience; be even tempered; content with second place; quick to forgive an offense, just as the Lord forgave you. And regardless of what else you put on, wear love over it all. It's your basic all purpose garment. It's the perfect bond of unity completing the new look. Never be without it." (MB) That is how you can be perfectly dressed in your best. Now, take these words to heart and wear them daily.

We'll finish with these last verses 15-17; this is how to experience joy and inner peace dressed in your best. "Let the peace of God keep you in step with each other. None of this going off and doing your own thing. Cultivate thankfulness! Let the Word of Christ – the message – have full run of your house. Give it plenty of room in your life. And, help one another to learn and know this life of meaningful purpose. Sing your heart out to God – let every action, word and thought be done in the name of Jesus – thanking God the Father every step of the way."
